

PORT OF NEWPORT

ORDINANCE NO. 1-1979

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE USE, CONTROL AND REGULATION OF ELECTRICAL FACILITIES ON PORT PROPERTY AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, certain electrical facilities have been provided at Port of Newport docks, and

WHEREAS, the Port desires to regulate the use thereof,

NOW, THEREFORE, the Port of Newport ordains as follows:

Section 1. Said electrical facilities may be used only with the express consent of the Port of Newport, and upon condition that all charges for the use thereof and all moorage charges shall be paid and kept current; such consent may be revoked at any time, at the option of the Port of Newport.

Section 2. The Port of Newport assumes no risk or responsibility for the use of said electrical facilities, and each user, by making connection thereto, assumes all risks inherent in such use.

Section 3. No person shall make any electrical connection to any electrical outlet of the Port of Newport except through the use of an approved cord and plug. Failure to use a safe, proper and approved plug, in good condition and repair, shall be grounds for immediate severance of any such electrical condition, without notice, at the option of the Port.

Section 4. All electrical facilities erected on the Port docks for the purpose of providing electrical use shall not be used for any other purpose, and no person shall tie or connect any rope, line or make any attachment or moor any vessel to any Port of Newport electrical stanchion or other electrical facility.

Section 5. Violation of this ordinance shall, at the option of the Port of Newport, be grounds for immediate termination of any moorage contract or agreement entered into after the effective date hereof. Further, any violation of this ordinance shall be punishable by imprisonment for a period not exceeding 180 days, or by a fine not to exceed \$500, or both. This ordinance may be enforced as set forth in Section 10 of general ordinance No. 1, 1974, of the Port of Newport, as hereinafter amended.

Section 6. This ordinance being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, safety and welfare, an emergency is declared to exist, and this ordinance shall be effective immediately upon its adoption.
